JOURNAL OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, PERRY COUNTY, MISSOURI.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Perry County, Missouri, met at City Hall in said City on the above date in regular session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Ken Baer, Mayor; Tom Guth, Prince Hudson, Douglas K. Martin, Larry Riney, and David J. Schumer, Aldermen; Brent Buerck, City Administrator; Tracy Prost, City Clerk; and Thomas Ludwig, City Attorney. Absent: Alderman Curt Buerck.

Mayor Baer opens the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and the invocation.

Mayor Baer now opens the meeting for citizens' participation from the floor.

There being no one coming forth, Mayor Baer closes the citizens' participation portion of the meeting.

END OF CONSENT AGENDA

At this time, Mayor Baer asks if anyone wishes to remove anything from the Consent Agenda.

Alderman Riney makes a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Alderman Hudson seconds the motion, and on vote the motion carries.

SECOND READINGS AND FINAL PASSAGE:

Now, at this time, the Board proceeds to approve Bill No. 6014, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 9, CHAPTER 9.04, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, RELATIVE TO PANHANDLING; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH. Bill No. 6014 is read a second time on motion by Alderman Riney, seconded by Alderman Guth. Thereupon on motion by Alderman Riney, seconded by Alderman Guth, and on vote carried, it is ordered that the bill be placed on final passage. Roll call showed the aye and nay vote as follows: Curt Buerck, absent; Tom Guth, aye; Prince Hudson, aye; Douglas K. Martin, aye; Larry Riney, aye; David J. Schumer, aye. Totals: aye, five; nay, none; absent, one. The Mayor thereupon declared the bill passed and approved and the bill thereupon became Ordinance No. 6232 of the City of Perryville, and is in words and figures as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 9, CHAPTER 9.04, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, RELATIVE TO PANHANDLING; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Title 9, Chapter 9.04, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Perryville, Missouri, is hereby amended by adding Section 9.04.065 to read as follows:

“9.04.065 Panhandling.

2. Definitions. The following terms used in this section shall be defined as follows:

2. ‘Aggressive Panhandling’ means panhandling in the following manner:

2. To approach or speak to a person in such a manner as would cause a reasonable person to believe that the person is being threatened with:

2. Imminent bodily injury; or

ii. The commission of a criminal act upon the person or another person or upon property in the person’s immediate possession.

b. To persist in panhandling after the person solicited has given a negative response.

c. To block, either individually or as part of a group of persons, the passage of a solicited person.

d. To touch a solicited person without the person’s consent.

e. To render any service to a motor vehicle including, but not limited to, any cleaning, washing, protecting, guarding, or repairing of said vehicle or any portion thereof without the prior consent of the owner, operator, or occupant of such vehicle and thereafter asking, begging, or soliciting alms or payment for the performance of such service, regardless of whether such vehicle is stopped, standing, or parked on a public street or upon other public or private property.

f. To engage in conduct that would reasonably be construed as intended to intimidate, compel, or force a solicited person to make a donation.

2. ‘Charitable Organization’ means any nonprofit community organization; fraternal, benevolent, educational, philanthropic, or service organization; or governmental employee organization; which solicits or obtains contributions solicited from the public for charitable purposes or holds any assets solely for charitable purposes.

3. 'Panhandling' means any solicitation in person by a person, other than a charitable organization, for an immediate grant of money, goods, or any other form of gratuity from another person(s) when the person making the request is not known to the person(s) who is the subject of the request. The term panhandling shall not mean the act of passively standing or sitting with a sign or other indicator that a donation of money, goods, or any other form of gratuity is being sought without any vocal request other than a response to an inquiry by another person.

B. Prohibitions.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in aggressive panhandling.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the act of panhandling when either the panhandler or the person being solicited is located in, on, or at any of the following locations:
 2. In any public transportation vehicle;
 - b. Within fifty (50) feet of an automatic teller machine or entrance to a bank;
 - c. Within thirty (30) feet of a point of entry to or exit from any building open to the public, including commercial establishments;
 - d. Any sidewalk café;
 - e. Within fifty (50) feet of any public or private school;
 - f. At any bus stop, train stop, or cab stand;
 - g. Within twenty (20) feet of any crosswalk;
 - h. Within any municipal or government owned building, park, golf course, or playground.
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the act of panhandling on private property or inside a business without the written permission from the owner of the real estate or the owner of the business.
4. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the act of panhandling after 8:00 p.m. and before 7:00 a.m.
5. It shall be unlawful for any person to panhandle in a group of two or more persons.

C. Penalty. The penalty for this offense is as made and provided in Section 1.16.010.”

Section 2. It is the intent of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, and it is hereby ordained that this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Perryville, Missouri, and that sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a

separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY AND **LAPPE CEMENT FINISHING, INC.** RELATIVE TO **FIRE DEPARTMENT CONCRETE APRON REPLACEMENT PROJECT**; FURTHER SAID ORDINANCE SHALL AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE CITY CLERK TO ATTEST THE SIGNATURE OF THE MAYOR.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen have heretofore reviewed a contract, marked Exhibit A and attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully set forth; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, deem it advisable to enter into said contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville approve the contract marked Exhibit A and attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully set forth between the City of Perryville, a municipal corporation, and **Lappe Cement Finishing, Inc.** It is the belief of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Perryville, that the City enters into said contract.

2. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute said contract for and on behalf of the City of Perryville, Missouri.

Now, at this time, Bill No. 6016, AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE PLAT OF ROGER'S RIDGE; ACCEPTING DEDICATION OF EASEMENTS, STREETS AND PROPERTIES DESCRIBED; ACCEPTING RESTRICTIONS, IF ANY, FILED THEREWITH; AUTHORIZING THE RECORDING OF SAID PLAT; ACCEPTING IMPROVEMENTS CONSTRUCTED OR TO BE CONSTRUCTED AND INDICATED ON SAID PLAT; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH, is read for the first time with an expedite clause for matters related to zoning as found in Title 17 of the Code of Ordinances upon motion by Alderman Riney, seconded by Alderman Guth. On motion by Alderman Riney, seconded by Alderman Guth, and on vote carried, Bill No. 6016 is read for the second time. Thereupon on motion by Alderman Riney, seconded by Alderman Guth, and on vote carried, it is ordered that the Bill be placed on final passage. AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE PLAT OF ROGER'S RIDGE; ACCEPTING DEDICATION OF EASEMENTS, STREETS AND PROPERTIES DESCRIBED; ACCEPTING RESTRICTIONS, IF ANY, FILED THEREWITH; AUTHORIZING THE RECORDING OF SAID PLAT; ACCEPTING IMPROVEMENTS CONSTRUCTED OR TO BE CONSTRUCTED AND INDICATED ON SAID PLAT; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, Wade John Elder and Amy Elder have platted Roger's Ridge as located within the corporate limits of the City of Perryville, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, the developer has installed required improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the developer has complied with all of the city ordinances and, in particular, Title 17 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Perryville, Missouri.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOW:

Section 1. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, do hereby accept the final plat of Roger's Ridge, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, including all easements, right-of-way streets and improvements indicated thereon and subject to the terms and conditions expressed therein.

Section 2. The Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Perryville, Missouri, are hereby authorized to do all acts and execute all instruments appropriate and necessary to accept said plat.

Section 3. The City Clerk of the City of Perryville, Missouri, is hereby directed to file a copy of said plat with the Recorder of Deeds, Perry County, Missouri.

Section 4. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, hereby declare this ordinance to be a matter related to zoning as found in Title 17 of this Code which has previously been reviewed and approved by the City Planning and Zoning Commission and for that reason this ordinance may be acted on in one meeting.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Alderman Martin presents motion, seconded by Alderman Schumer, and on vote carried Bill No. 6022, entering into an AWOS Maintenance Service Renewal agreement with DBT Transportation Services, is read for the first time by title only. The heading is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY AND **DBT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES** RELATIVE TO **AWOS AVIATION SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE SERVICES;** FURTHER SAID ORDINANCE SHALL AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE CITY CLERK TO ATTEST THE SIGNATURE OF THE MAYOR.

Alderman Riney presents motion, seconded by Alderman Guth, and on vote carried Bill No. 6023, Show Me Green Sales Tax Holiday for 2020, is read for the first time by title only. The heading is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING THE "SHOW ME GREEN SALES TAX HOLIDAY" TO APPLY TO THE LOCAL SALES TAXES OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, BETWEEN APRIL 19 AND APRIL 25, 2020.

Alderman Guth, as Chairman of the Public Works Committee, asks about the rules regarding trash collection; specifically, is a homeowner allowed to throw extra items into the trash truck when the truck stops at their house if their can is already full, and, can you place trash in your neighbor's can if they have agreed to allow it. City Administrator Buerck informs the Board that both of those scenarios are not allowed by ordinance.

Alderman Riney, as Chairman of the Finance Committee, thanks staff for their work on the preparation of the budget. He informs the Board that he believes the budget for 2020-21 is a good budget, noting that, although infrastructure repairs and replacement are not necessarily seen by the public, they are very valuable to the entire city.

Alderman Guth, as Chairman of the Economic Development Committee, asks EDA Director Sattler to update the Board on any economic development activity. Director Sattler updates the Board on the

progress of his new office location; his attendance at the International Council of Shopping Centers; and his upcoming vacation where he will be sworn in as the District Governor for the Lion's Club.

City Administrator Buerck report:

- **Board Appreciation Dinner** – Staff originally planned to set this annual dinner on Friday, April 17, but has since learned that there is a conflict on that evening. We are working to find a new date and will let the Board know when the date is finalized.

City Engineer Baer reports:

- **Sycamore Road** – The concrete portion of this project has slowed due to weather; however, the sewer line is completed.

- **Sidewalk Connection Miget Park to Soccer Park** – The official letter from MoDot to proceed on this project has been received. We are setting the bid opening date for February 27. Staff is hopeful that the contract can be finalized by mid-April.

- **Vincent Street Water Project** – Bids for this project will be opened next week on February 12.

- **Firehouse Project** – The contract was approved at tonight's meeting and construction should start soon.

Mayor Baer asks the Board for any concerns or comments or other non-action items.

Alderman Martin says he received a question from a citizen who noticed some surveying work being done near his home. City Engineer Baer says that his crews are surveying along the Dry Run Branch area for the trunk line project.

Alderman Hudson informs the Board that he was checking into a gas pressure issue for St. Vincent High School. He would like to commend the City's gas crew for the good job they did reviewing the problem and explaining why the issue was not caused because of a problem with the City's gas system.

Alderman Hudson asks if City Hall lights have been converted to LED. City Administrator Buerck informs the Board that the lights were converted several years ago to T-2, but not yet converted to LED.

Now, at this time, upon motion by Alderman Martin, seconded by Alderman Riney, it is ordered that the Board now convene into Closed Session to discuss contractual matters in accordance with Section 610.021(9) RSMo; and personnel matters in accordance with Section 610.021(3) RSMo. Roll call showed the aye and nay votes as follows: Curt Buerck, absent; Tom Guth, aye; Prince Hudson, aye; Douglas K. Martin, aye; Larry Riney, aye; David J. Schumer, aye. Totals: aye, five; nay, none; absent, one.

Following discussion and review, it is upon motion by Alderman Hudson, seconded by Alderman Riney, that the Board now reconvenes into regular session for any business that might come forth.
