JOURNAL OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, PERRY COUNTY, MISSOURI.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Perry County, Missouri, met at City Hall in said City on the above date in regular session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Ken Baer, Mayor; Curt Buerck, Tom Guth, Prince Hudson, Douglas K. Martin, Larry Riney, and David J. Schumer, Aldermen; Brent Buerck, City Administrator; Tracy Prost, City Clerk; and Thomas Ludwig, City Attorney.

Mayor Baer opens the meeting. Alderman Martin leads the Pledge of Allegiance and invocation.

Mayor Baer now opens the meeting for citizens' participation from the floor.

There being no one coming forth, Mayor Baer closes the citizens' participation portion of the meeting.

Assistant Chief Jones introduces newly-hired police officer Eli Isgriggs.

At this time, Mayor Baer asks if anyone wishes to remove anything from the Consent Agenda.

City Administrator Buerck now presents information to the Board of Aldermen regarding the current condition of the Park Center's roof. He informs the Board that both internal and external spot repairs have been made on the roof over the past several years; however, this past winter has again exposed several weaknesses and new leaks. Although this project is found in the City's CIP, it was not placed in next year's budget and it appears that one section needs to be repaired this budget year. Staff will prepare a Request for Qualifications to select an architect/engineer to develop specifications to replace different portions of the roof over the course of several years, beginning first with the portion that is currently leaking and seems to be beyond our ability to repair. Parks & Recreation Director Cadwell notes that the roof is 23 years old and was expected to last 20 years.

It is the belief of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Perryville, that the City enters into said contract.
- 2. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute said contract for and on behalf of the City of Perryville, Missouri.
- 3. That the City Clerk of the City of Perryville is hereby authorized and directed to attest the signature of the Mayor on the attached contract.
- 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portions shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.
 - 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Alderman Guth, as Chairman of the Economic Development Committee, asks Economic Development Director Scott Sattler to update the Board on recent activities. EDA Director Sattler informs the Board: (a) he continues to work on the feasibility study for the community college; (b) Habitat for Humanity has been unable to find a family for the property the city donated at 403 West North Street and, therefore, plan to return the property to the city; (c) he is working on a transportation grant; and (d) he met with the Downtown Revitalization Committee about the 2021 events and should have dates at the next meeting.

City Administrator Report:

- Spring Leaf Removal March 22-26 This will be the final week for curbside leaf removal for this winter.
 - **Spring Cleaning April 12-16** This is the week for this year's Spring cleanup.
- **FAA Airport Inspection –** We received a favorable inspection at the airport. Barbara Maxwell has been doing a good job there. Public Works Director Layton is working on our response, but things are going very well at the airport as far as MoDot is concerned.

City Engineer Report:

- **Highway T Water Line Project –** The bore under the highway was completed today and we expect the line to be hooked up and pressure tested by the end of the week.
 - CIPP Insituform is back in town to connect the service lines. This should take several weeks.
- **NE Outfall Sewer Project –** We continue to work on securing easements for this project. Staff will begin making contacts for in-person visits.

Alderman Hudson asks if there is a sinkhole at the intersection of Rosati and Waters Streets. City Engineer Baer believes there is a pipe there. He will check his notes and contact Alderman Hudson.

Parks & Recreation Director Cadwell informs the Board that: (a) Theater/Concession Supervisor Boxdorfer welcomed twins boys today; (b) the ribbon cutting was held at the Perry Park Center Locker Room last week; (c) the final report for the TRIM grant has been submitted; this is a 60/40 split; (d) the second vaccine event at the Perry Park Center went very well; (e) the mud at the men's softball field has been cleared.

Mayor Baer asks the Board for any concerns, comments, or other non-action items they would like to present.

Alderman Riney asks about the conservation area in the park. City Administrator Buerck informs the Board that plans are underway to burn the area tomorrow. He intends to plan an annual burn of this area. Alderman Riney asks that the area be maintained, perhaps once a month.

Alderman Guth notes that the new showers in the Perry Park Center need a place for people to put their soap, etc. Parks & Recreation Director Cadwell informs the Board that their staff is setting that up.

Alderman Schumer asks Public Works Director Layton if they have checked on the tree he is concerned about on Big Springs Boulevard. PW Director Layton tells the Board that they will check on the tree.

Alderman Hudson asks for an update on the sinkhole work at the golf course. City Engineer Baer informs the Board that the sinkhole appears to be 15-20 feet deep. PW Director Layton notes that the contractor was working on the sinkhole today.

Now, at this time, upon motion by Alderman Schumer, seconded by Alderman Buerck, it is ordered that the Board now convene into closed session to discuss real estate matters in accordance with Section 610.021(2) RSMo; and contractual matters in accordance with Section 610.021(9) RSMo. Roll call showed the aye and nay votes as follows: Curt Buerck, aye; Tom Guth, aye; Prince Hudson, aye; Douglas K. Martin, aye; Larry Riney, aye; David J. Schumer, aye. Totals: aye, six; nay, none.

Following discussion and review, it is upon motion by Alderman Hudson, seconded by Alderman Riney, that the Board now reconvenes into regular session for any business that might come forth. There being no further business, it is upon motion by Alderman Schumer, second by Alderman Hudson, and on vote carried, ordered that the Board now adjourn until Tuesday, March 16, 2021, at 6:30 p.m., the regular meeting in course.
