JOURNAL OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, PERRY COUNTY, MISSOURI.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Perry County, Missouri, met at City Hall in said City on the above date in regular session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Ken Baer, Mayor; Curt Buerck, Tom Guth, Prince Hudson, Douglas K. Martin, Larry Riney, and David J. Schumer, Aldermen; Brent Buerck, City Administrator; Tracy Prost, City Clerk; and Thomas Ludwig, City Attorney.

Mayor Baer opens the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and leads the invocation.

Mayor Baer now opens the meeting for citizens' participation from the floor.

Sylvia Forester, Director of the Perry County Health Department, and Liz House, Assistant Director, update the Board of Aldermen on the coronavirus pandemic that has been sweeping the world and is now posing an issue for the United States. As of 5:45 p.m. this date, there are 15 known positive cases in the State of Missouri; there are no cases in Perry County and none under investigation at this time. They review the guidance that has been directed by the state and the Governor's office. Gatherings of 50 or more are prohibited; however, that number could be reduced. Schools are closed until further notice and it is suggested that travel be limited. Social distancing is being suggested and people are being asked to "shelter in place" if they have been exposed to the virus.

Mayor Baer and City Administrator Buerck commend the Health Department for their response to this serious health issue. Mayor Baer states that people in our community are being responsive, noting that meetings and events are being cancelled.

Robert Mills, of 1025 Old St. Mary's Road, Apartment 1, Perryville, now approaches the Board and shares his concerns about the possibility of residents being cynical about the seriousness of the coronavirus situation. He believes people are angry and in a panic. He suggests that communication is the key.

Director Forester interjects that the Health Department is creating a resource guide for citizens that may need help

There being no one else coming forth, Mayor Baer closes the citizens' participation portion of the meeting.

Mayor Baer now opens a public hearing for consideration of a petition for the creation of the Perry Plaza Community Improvement District.

City Administrator Buerck informs the Board that city staff has worked with the owner of the Perry Plaza to develop a plan to improve the appearance and function of this property by way of a Community Improvement District (CID). He notes that this is the same method that Cape Girardeau used to improve their plaza several years ago.

There being no one else coming forth, Mayor Baer closes the public hearing for consideration of a petition for the creation of the Perry Plaza Community Improvement District.

ORDINANCE NO. 6248

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 5, CHAPTER 5.04, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, RELATIVE TO REMEDIES RELATED TO OPERATING WITHOUT A BUSINESS LICENSE; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Title 5, Chapter 5.04, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Perryville, Missouri, is hereby amended by adding Section 5.04.119 to read as follows:

“5.04.119 Remedies—termination of utility services.

- A. Utility services to any person, business, or corporation operating without a current business license will be terminated by the city.
- B. The city shall give each person, business, or corporation at least ten days written notice of its intention to terminate utility services by delivering said notice to the office of the person, business, or corporation or by mailing said notice to the last known address of such person, business, or corporation. Proof of actual receipt of said written notice by such person, business, or corporation shall not be required.
- C. In the event utility services are terminated as provided for herein, no utility services shall again be provided to such person, business, or corporation conducting business within the city until a current business license has been purchased and all penalties and utility disconnection/reconnection fees have been paid in full.”

Section 2. That Title 5, Chapter 5.04, Section 5.04.120, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Perryville, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

“5.04.120 Remedies—court action for operating without a business license.

It shall be unlawful for any person, business, or corporation to either fail to obtain or fail to maintain a business license as required in this code. Punishment for violation of this chapter shall be as set forth in Section 1.16.010 of this code. In addition to any other penalty and/or remedy available to the city under this code, the city may seek injunctive relief in

circuit court against any person, business, or corporation who fails to obtain and/or maintain a business license as required under this code.”

Section 3. It is the intent of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, and it is hereby ordained that this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Perryville, Missouri, and that sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE 2019-20 BUDGET AS ORIGINALLY APPROVED ON THE 19TH DAY OF MARCH, 2019, BY REVISING, CONFIRMING, AND UPDATING END-OF-YEAR BALANCES; CONFIRMING BUDGETARY EXPENDITURES; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

WHEREAS, on the 19th day of March, 2019, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, approved the budget for the City of Perryville, Missouri for the 2019-20 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City budget officer has reviewed end-of-year balances and found it necessary to update said end-of-year balances projected for the 2019-20 fiscal year budget; and

WHEREAS, the amended end-of-year balances indicate and confirm sufficient funds to fund budgeted projects for the 2019-20 fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 2. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen further reconfirm and readopt budgetary expenditures as set out in the amended budget, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and order the administration of the City to follow the budget expenditures in accordance therewith, subject to the subsequent amendment of this Board.

ORDINANCE NO. 6250

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE 2020-21 BUDGET, AS AMENDED, FOR THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, AS MADE AND PROVIDED IN SECTION 67.010, ET SEQ., RSMO, 2000.

WHEREAS, the budget officer of the City of Perryville, Missouri, has heretofore presented to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen a proposed budget for the City of Perryville, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, after due consideration of said proposed budget, deem certain amendments necessary thereto; and

WHEREAS, the budget officer of the City of Perryville, Missouri, has heretofore presented the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen an amended budget for the 2020-21 fiscal year of the City of Perryville, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, being mindful of the requirements of Section 67.010, et seq., RSMo, 2000, deem it desirable to approve said budget by ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PERRYVILLE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, do hereby approve the 2020-21 proposed budget as submitted by the City budget officer and as heretofore reviewed and amended by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri.

Section 2. That in accordance with Section 67.030, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen are mindful of limitations on amendment of the budget for the fiscal year 2020-21 as made and provided in said section.

Section 3. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri, approved the amended budget for the year 2020-21 for the City of Perryville, Missouri, being mindful of the provisions of Section 67.040, RSMo, 2000, and that said section requires that any changes in expenditures set forth in this approved budget can only be effectuated upon showing that said increase in expenditures has been approved by formal ordinance of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Perryville, Missouri.

Section 4. That attached hereto, marked Exhibit A, and incorporated herein as if fully set forth is the amended budget for fiscal year 2020-21 for the City of Perryville, Missouri, as amended heretofore by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen.

Tobacco product does not include drugs, devices, or combination products authorized for sale by the U. S. Food and Drug Administration as those terms are defined in the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.
- B. The sale or distribution of any tobacco product to a person under the age of twenty-one (21) is prohibited.
- C. The purchase, attempted purchase, or possession of any tobacco product by any person under the age of twenty-one (21) is prohibited.
- D. Any person found guilty of the violation of the provisions of this section shall be punished as set forth in Section 1.16.010 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Perryville.”

Director Sattler informs the Board that the open house for the Catalyst Center was successful. He also informs the Board that, due to the recent coronavirus pandemic, the April Cruise In has been cancelled. The May Cruise In will be reviewed at the next Downtown Revitalization meeting. He reports that his office is collecting data on businesses effected by the virus and is working on a business resource guide. He also reports that the final sale of the lots in Red Bud Court is set for March 18, 2020.

City Administrator Buerck report:

- **Recycling Press Release** – The Recycling Center has taken positive actions to make recycling easier and more accessible to the public.
- **Transportation Meeting** – The Perry County EDA, SEMO Regional Planning Commission, and volunteers from the Perry County Employment Task Force and SMTS planned to have a meeting to discuss ways to help expand transportation options in Perry and Ste. Genevieve counties. That meeting has been postponed at this time.

City Engineer Baer reports:

- **Sycamore Road** – Some additional work has been performed on this project. We expect the crew to make additional concrete pours when the ground dries out.

- **Sidewalk Connection Miget Park to Soccer Park** – We received the concurrence from MoDot today on this project. Once we receive final approval from the Federal Highway Administration, we can issue the Notice to Proceed.

- **North Street Sewer** – The pipe work is complete and is on-line. This project will be finishing soon.

- **Vincent Street Water Project** – This project is scheduled to start next week.

City Attorney report:

- **Missouri Supreme Court** – Due to the coronavirus pandemic, the Missouri Supreme Court has ordered that all Missouri courts will be cancelled until April 3rd. Perryville's court is being postponed until May. These dates are subject to change depending on the progress of the coronavirus pandemic.

Parks & Recreation Director reports:

- **PPC Roof** – The roof has started to leak again. We have found a company to patch the roof and it appears to be a good job; however, the roof will need to be replaced in the future.

- **Master Trail Plan** – We have been meeting with SEMO Regional Planning to review the 5-year trail plan.

- **Batting Cages** – The golf net is proving to be too heavy for the frame of the batting cage, so extra support will be added.

Alderman Guth questions why the manufacturer didn't plan for the extra weight of the golf net. Parks & Recreation Director Cadwell explains that the Parks & Recreation staff designed the batting cage. They have since spoken with the manufacturer to ensure the additional poles will be sufficient to hold the weight of the net.

Mayor Baer asks the Board for any concerns or comments or other non-action items.

Alderman Schumer reports that East Harvest Circle, near the Hope Center, appears to be washing away and needs to be repaired.

Alderman Buerck asks if the Spring leaf pickup is going to be extended. After discussion, it is the consensus of the Board that the pickup season be extended to ensure that leaves are picked up. Public Works Director Layton informs the Board that crews are also picking up leaves while they are cleaning catch boxes.

Now, at this time, upon motion by Alderman Schumer, seconded by Alderman Riney, it is ordered that the Board now convene into Closed Session to discuss contractual matters in accordance with Section 610.021(9) RSMo; and security matters in accordance with Section 610.021(19) RSMo. Roll call showed the aye and nay votes as follows: Curt Buerck, aye; Tom Guth, aye; Prince Hudson, aye; Douglas K. Martin, aye; Larry Riney, aye; David J. Schumer, aye. Totals: aye, six; nay, none.

Following discussion and review, it is upon motion by Alderman Hudson, seconded by Alderman Buerck, that the Board now reconvenes into regular session for any business that might come forth. Roll call showed the aye and nay votes as follows: Curt Buerck, aye; Tom Guth, aye; Prince Hudson, aye; Douglas K. Martin, aye; Larry Riney, aye; David J. Schumer, aye. Totals: aye, six; nay, none.

There being no further business, it is upon motion by Alderman Hudson, seconded by Alderman Buerck, and on vote carried, ordered that the Board now adjourn until Tuesday, April 7, 2020, at 6:30 p.m., the regular meeting in course.
